

Frequently Asked Questions

What are the dates for the 2026 Red Rock Jamboree?

The dates for the 2026 Red Rock Jamboree are April 29th – May 2nd.

Do riders have to wear a helmet?

For riders under age 18, it's the law, they must wear a helmet. It's advised, but optional, for other riders.

What are the out-of-state requirements for participants?

The Red Rock Jamboree is exempt from Utah out-of-state registration requirements during the Jamboree. However, vehicles must have a current registration for the state you reside in. If you are riding before or after the Jamboree, you must have a Utah non-resident permit and complete an adult (18+) education requirement. Youths must possess an OHV education certificate before operating an OHV on public land. Check out the Utah OHV website at <https://recreation.utah.gov/off-highway-vehicles/>

What is the fee to participate in the 2026 Red Rock Jamboree?

The cost is \$150 per person plus tax and fees. This year the Bureau of Land Management is requiring us to pay a fee of \$21 per registrant to ride on BLM lands. The Jamboree is not able to absorb this fee. You will see a line item reflecting this fee on your registration. Children 12 and under are free. The driver and all passengers (including children) must register. The fee includes three days of guided rides, dinners on Thursday and Saturday, an official jamboree T-shirt, a swag bag, and entry into the general raffle drawings.

Where do I check in at the Jamboree?

Check-in will be on Wednesday, April 29th from 3 pm to 8 pm at the Kanab Center in Kanab, Utah, address 172 East 100 North (Rear parking area). For those who are walking to the Kanab Center the front address is 20 N 100 E.

What if I miss the check-in on Wednesday?

If you miss the check-in on Wednesday you should let us know via email (utazatvclubrides@gmail.com) or text 860-682-0079 when you will be arriving. Late check-in will be arranged once you contact us.

Can I bring my dog to the Jamboree?

Dogs are allowed on jamboree rides, but they must be under control and on a leash at all times. Also please be courteous by picking up after your animal. DOGS ARE NOT ALLOWED ON THE GROUNDS OF THE KANAB CENTER OR THE JACOB HAMBLIN PARK.

What is your cancellation/refund policy?

A full refund of registration fees will be issued if you cancel no later than **March 15th, 2026**. Cancellations between March 16th, 2026, and April 10th, 2026, will incur a \$25 fee per person. After April 10th, 2026, no refunds will be issued. There is an option during registration to add Purchase Protection to your registration. Purchase Protection is offered by the registration platform and the Red Rock Jamboree is not affiliated with Purchase Protection. Read the terms before making your decision about Purchase Protection.

Can I switch rides after registration?

The rides you choose at registration are the rides you will go on during the Jamboree. If you make a mistake when choosing your rides, contact us as soon as possible at utazatvclubrides@gmail.com and we will try to make the correction if there is still space in the ride you want. If you want to ride with another registrant, we suggest that you register at the same time and make sure there are enough remaining spots available for the whole group.

What is the weather like during the Jamboree?

The weather in Kanab during May can range from sunny and hot to cloudy with rain, sleet, or snow! Be prepared for whatever Mother Nature brings our way.

What is the difference between a Moderate, Advanced, and Extreme Ride?

Moderate:

These rides are mostly dirt/sand roads that most riders will find fairly easy. There may be a couple of opportunities that provide a small challenge, but these are kept to a minimum and traveled in the easiest direction. A good option for all machines and skill levels.

Advanced:

These rides have more challenges than our Moderate rides. There are only a few advanced spots on the trails, however, they may require a higher level of skill and confidence to navigate. We would recommend a minimum of 60" machine for these trails to avoid problems.

Extreme:

These rides have many more technical challenges with steep rock ascents and descents. They may require winching and vehicle damage is possible. We require a minimum of 60" machines and wider is preferable. Must be highly skilled riders with high clearance vehicles.

What do I need to bring with me on the rides?

Each participant should bring their lunch and plenty of water or other non-alcoholic beverages. We also recommend sunglasses, a hat, and a jacket as the weather can change quickly.

Why aren't you offering breakfast this year or staging the rides at the Kanab Center as in previous years?

Due to circumstances beyond our control, we no longer have a venue available to use to serve breakfast or to stage the rides from. There are several restaurant options available for breakfast if your motel doesn't offer breakfast.

How do I join your club?
